## DRESS CODE

To promote a safe environment that is aligned with our school vision of expanding the pursuit of excellence. MINIMUM STANDARD OF DRESS

## All students shall maintain the following minimum standard of dress:

1. Appropriate shoes shall be worn. No Slippers
2. Midriffs shall be covered.
3. Appropriate under-garments shall be worn and may not be visible.
4. Strapless garments can not be worn

5. Tank-tops- 2 inches width at shoulder
6. Appropriate shorts that cover the entire backside.
7. No caps, hats, bandanas nor hoods covering the head are to be worn in the school buildings during the school day
8. Pajamas, slippers, and blankets are not to be worn
9. Clothing or ornamentation that does any of the following is prohibited:
a. Displays or advertises substances illegal for minors.
b. Displays suggestive phrases, designs, markings, or profanities.
c. Advocates, promotes, or suggests illegal activity.
*The principal or designee shall be the final judge as to the appropriateness of the apparel, and whether the apparel is disruptive, unsafe, or in violation of the dress code. If in doubt, do not wear the outfit.

## DISMISSAL/

 BUS- Safety is the priority!
- Please follow marked signs in parking lot for proper procedures

- Check individual Teacher CTLS page so you know what your kids are studying in class (can help with conversation starters)
- Check the Eagle Card in their Agenda

## MAYBE TRY A FEW OF THESE:

Keep a daily routine as much as you can

Sundays are a good time to go over the weekly events, tests, projects etc.

Make sure your child has a consistent spot to study and complete homework at home

Have a basket on the table or counter that holds papers for parent signature, items parent needs to look at

Teach time management by giving them tips for using their agenda, use sticky notes, to do lists, dry erase board etc.
